The student-led approach is the core of this program where student ambassadors are taught about the importance and fundamentals of voting, and then through a peer-to-peer approach, educate their classmates about the process. The program trains high school juniors and seniors to register classmates to vote and encourages them to hold non-partisan voter registration drives at their schools. Student Ambassadors are also encouraged to recruit qualifying students to serve as Student Election Judges on Election Day.

QUALIFICATIONS

High school students may qualify to be an Election Judge if they:

- Are a high school junior or senior in good standing.
- Maintain a GPA of 3.0 on a scale of 4.0.
- Obtain written approval from principal, teacher, and parent.
- Successfully complete the state required training session.
- Students who will be 17 years old during a Primary Election but who will be 18 years old on a Presidential Election can register to vote and may cast ballots in both elections.
 Per Illinois statute (10 ILCS 5/3-6), these students also may qualify to serve as Deputy Registrars.

ELECTION JUDGE TRAINING

In each precinct, at least one judge representing each political party must be certified as having satisfactorily completed, within the preceding six months, a training course and examination for judges of election. This required course covers the duties and responsibilities of election judges and consists of at least four hours of instruction and an examination to test reading skills, ability to work with poll lists, ability to add, and knowledge of election laws governing the operation of polling places.

Election Judges help guarantee the rights of voters are protected on Election Day. This page details the qualifications necessary to become an Election Judge and also some of the important duties and responsibilities.

What Are Judges Of Election? Judges of elections are responsible for the administration of election procedures in the polling place on Election Day. They are in the position of ensuring that the election process is administered fairly and in accordance with the law.

Can High School Or College Students Serve **As Judges?** Yes. An election authority may establish a program to permit a person who is not entitled to vote to serve as an Election Judge if the individual meets the following qualifications:

- Is a citizen of the United States.
- Is a junior or senior in good standing enrolled in a public or private secondary school, or is a student currently enrolled in community college or a public or private Illinois University or College.
- If currently enrolled in a secondary school, has the written approval of both the principal and a parent or legal guardian.
- Has a cumulative grade point average of at least a 3.0 on a 4.0 scale.
- Has satisfactorily completed the training course for Election Judges.
- Meets all other qualifications for appointment and service as an Election Judge.

NOTE: Not more than one Election Judge per party per precinct shall be a participant in aforementioned program.

How Are Judges Selected? Election Judges are chosen by Precinct Committeemen. The party which cast the highest average number of votes at the most recent three gubernatorial elections in the precinct shall be represented by three judges, the party which casts the second highest number of votes at the most recent gubernatorial elections in the precinct shall be represented by two judges.

How Are Judges Trained? Before each election, several Election Judge training schools will be held. This course covers the duties and responsibilities of Election Judges. An examination which tests reading skills, ability to work with poll lists, ability to add, and knowledge of election laws governing the operation of polling places is given every two years.

How May I Become An Election Judge? Contact the County Clerk's office by phone or e-mail and express your interest in serving as a judge of elections. Election Judges are vital to ensure efficient and honest elections to which voters are entitled in a democratic society.

What Are The Qualifications Necessary To Be An Election Judge?

- Be a citizen of the United States.
- Be of good repute and character and not subject to the registration requirement of the Sex Offender Registration Act.
- Be able to speak, read, and write the English language.
- Be skilled in the four fundamental rules of mathematics.

- Be of good understanding and physically capable of handling election related equipment.
- Not be a candidate for any office in the election and not be an elected committeeman.
- Reside in and be entitled to vote in the precinct where selected to serve as a judge.
 - However, in each precinct one judge of each party may be appointed from outside the precinct, but from within the county all judges must be electors within the

What Are Some Of The **Duties Of The Election Judges?**

- To open and close the polls.
- To be responsible for all election materials.
- To ensure that only qualified voters are permitted to vote and that each qualified voter is permitted to vote once and only once.
- To ensure that all votes are cast in secret.
- To give instructions in the method of voting when requested by a voter.
- To give assistance to illiterate and physically disabled voters.
- To maintain order in the polling place throughout the day.
- To tally the votes after the polls are closed; and to certify the election results in that precinct.
