CIRCULAR LETTER 2021-09

IDOT POLICY AND GUIDANCE FOR BRIDGE INSPECTION COMMENTS AND DOCUMENTATION

COUNTY ENGINEERS/ SUPERINTENDENTS OF HIGHWAYS MUNICIPAL ENGINEERS/ DIRECTORS OF PUBLIC WORKS/ MAYORS METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATIONS - DIRECTORS TOWNSHIP HIGHWAY COMMISSIONERS CONSULTING ENGINEERS

This Circular Letter is to provide information to Local Public Agencies of an effort to improve the State of Illinois compliance with the National Bridge Inspection Program (NBIP).

Issue: Inadequate Bridge Inspection Comments/Remarks

History/Purpose

In 2011, the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) implemented a data-driven, risk-based approach to oversight of the NBIP and monitoring State compliance with the National Bridge Inspection Standards (NBIS).

Under this approach, the FHWA assesses 23 compliance metrics, each having direct reference to the NBIS. Metric 12 assesses Quality Inspections, which evaluates the inspection condition rating appraisal comments and inspection remarks to ensure all notable deficiencies are identified and the narrative appropriately justifies and documents the condition rating. The FHWA measures a State's compliance for each metric and assigns it to one of three performance categories: Compliant, Substantially Compliant, or Non-Compliant.

The FHWA has determined the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) to be Substantially Compliant for NBIP Metric 12 in each year since 2015. In order to receive a Compliant determination for NBIP Metric 12, at least 90% of the inspection reports reviewed must have all notable bridge deficiencies identified <u>and</u> at least 90% of the inspection reports have condition codes supported by narrative that appropriately justifies and document the condition rating assigned. In order to receive a Substantially Compliant determination for NBIP Metric 12, at least 80% of the inspection reports reviewed must have all notable bridge deficiencies identified and at

least 80% of the inspection reports have condition codes supported by narrative that appropriately justifies and document the condition rating assigned.

After the FHWA determined IDOT was Substantially Compliant for NBIP Metric 12 in 2019, the FHWA-approved Improvement Plan developed by the Bureau of Bridges & Structures (BB&S) included an Action Item to review and revise current IDOT Bridge Inspection Policy/Guidance as it relates to the documentation of inspection findings.

Bridge Inspection Policy and Guidance for Bridge Inspection Documentation

Inspection Comments

The importance of quality condition rating comments is stated in the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR)- CFR Part 650- Subpart C 650.313(d):

"Maintain reports on the results of bridge inspections together with notations of any action taken to address the findings of such inspections. Maintain relevant maintenance and inspection data to allow assessment of current bridge condition. Record the findings and results of bridge inspections on standard State or Federal agency forms."

IDOT Bridge Inspection Policy and guidance can be found in the IDOT Structural Services Manual Section 3. The following requirements and guidance supersede/augment the applicable portions of Section 3.

Section 3.3.3 lists the overall functions of a Routine Inspection, one of which is to identify and document potential problems that might affect bridge safety.

- In order to accomplish this, quality and descriptive comments <u>must</u> be recorded, specifically for condition ratings.
- The Inspector's Appraisals section of the Routine Bridge Inspection Form, IDOT Form BBS BIR, contains a comment section adjacent to each condition rating item.
- A concise description of all deficiencies $\underline{\text{must}}$ be included for condition ratings \leq "5" (Fair) and should be included for condition ratings \geq "6" (Satisfactory).
- Any other notable deficiencies (e.g., slopewall problems, railing issues, etc.) should be recorded in the Inspection Remarks (Item 90B) field.

When the number of deficiencies makes it unfeasible to document each individually, the following is recommended.

- Utilize the words "scattered"; "moderate"; "extensive"; or other phrases to capture global conditions.
 - Example for a PPC Deck Beam with a Superstructure Condition Rating (Item 59) coding of 4:

"Scattered areas of single longitudinal cracking; delamination up to 8" wide; and spa/ling with exposed shear reinforcement up to 10" wide within the middle-half of the span on PPG Deck Beams 2; 5; and 9-11 (from the north)."

 Example of an RC Box Culvert with a Culvert Condition Rating (Item 60) coding of 3:

"Moderate areas of hairline map cracking with leaching and scattered areas of delamination and spa/ling with exposed primary reinforcement (section loss up to 35%) on top slab soffit of a box culvert."

o Example of an RC Deck with a Deck Condition Rating (Item 58) coding of 4:

"Moderate areas of delamination and spa/ling with exposed reinforcement (section loss up to 15% over a 6' bay length) on the deck soffit."

- Utilize inspection drawings/sketches in concert with comments provided on the Routine Bridge Inspection Form and photographs taken in the field. This is particularly helpful when steel bridges are encountered with multiple members having varying degrees of section loss.
 - Example of a Steel Multi-Beam with a Superstructure Condition Rating (Item 59) coding of 3:

"Beams 2; 3; & 6 have web section loss up to 20% at the west abutment and Beams 1 & 6 have bottom flange section loss up to 35% at the drain locations. See inspection sketch for details at these locations."

Below are examples of comments in the Inspector's Appraisal and Inspection Remarks (Item 908) sections as found in the Bridge Inspection System (BIS).

• Deck Condition Rating (Item 58): "4-Poor Condition":

"Large de/ams & spa/ls in soffit w/ exp rebar & sec loss. '14- trans leach crks w/ rust stains, map crks, potholes, shielding appears clean. '16- cont minor deter of surf & soffit, minor long erk in soffit. '18- redcd 5 to 4 due to cont soffit deter w/ add/ long, map, & diag crks & add/ potholes in surf.'19- cont surf & soffit deter. '20-WS has several depressions in areas of soffit shielding, many potholes and general surface deter - will drop in ratings soon."

• Superstructure Condition Rating (Item 59): "4-Poor Condition":

"Rust and sec loss in crit areas <10%. '14-N abut brgs misaligned due to worn off pint/es. '16- sec loss nearing 10%. '18- redcd 5 to 4 due to bm end loss >10% at NE quad & most abut brgs shifting &/or twisting. '19-cont hvy losses at ends, top fl pack elev dk, holes thru end diaphs, end loss nearing 30% - check 2019 LR/. '20-Bm end loss w/ small area of 100% Bm end loss beyond brg zone, brgs twisting out of alignment, btm flange loss in NE quad is notable."

• Substructure Condition Rating (Item 60): "4-Poor Condition":

"Long crks on abut, rust stains, de/ams & spa/ls wl exp rebar, large spa/l WI exp rebar at N side of S pier. '16- several bars exposd in cap, minor holes in backwa/l wl material loss, col spa/l on S pier wl exp rebar & sec loss. '18- redcd 6 to 4 due to con col core/area loss w/ mod loss to exp bars, pier cap deter/expsd stirrups wl losses. '19- cont cap deter/stirrup losses, cont slopewa/l voids, failed panels. '20-cont deter cone & stirrup loss at SW column; s/opewa/l voids cont to grow."

• Inspection Remarks (Item 908):

"14- cont deter of dk WS & soffit wl potholes, minor cont rust & sec loss to bm ends from failed exp jt - WO to blast & seal jt, brgs at N abut misaligned & twisted due to worn pint/es - WO to jack & fix, minor cont deter of sub w/ large spa/ls & exp rebar, large voids in addn to s/opewa/l failures at both abuts - WO to fix. '16- cont minor deter of surf & soffit, minor long erk in soffit, cont rust & loss of bm ends due to open Jt, subseveral bars exposd in cap, minor holes in backwa/l wl material loss, col

spall on S pier wl exp rebar & sec loss, WO to repair/rep/ brgs at NE quad, clean abut caps, fill s/opewalls, & seal open jts. '18- dk redcd 5 to 4 due to cont soffit deter wl add/ long, map, & diag crks & add/ potholes in surf, sup redcd 5 to 4 due to bm end loss >10% at NE quad & most abut brgs shifting &/or twisting, sub redcd 6 to 4 due to con col core/area loss w/mod loss to exp bars, pier cap deter/expsd stirrups wl losses. '19- dk-cont surf & soffit deter, sup- cont hvy losses at ends, top fl pack elev dk, holes thru end diaphs, end loss nearing 30% - check 2019 LR/, sub - cont cap deter/stirrup losses, cont s/opewa/1 voids, failed panels. '20-deck WS has several depressions in areas of soffit shielding, many potholes and general surface deter- will drop in ratings soon. Super-Bm end loss w/ small area of 100% Bm end loss beyond brg zone, brgs twisting out of alignment, btm flange loss in NE quad is notable. Sub-cont deter cone & stirrup loss at SW column; s/opewa/1 voids cont to grow."

When abbreviating, be sure to use abbreviations common/standard to the field of bridge engineering.

Inspection Photographs

Photographs are also an important part of bridge inspection documentation and are used to identify and document potential problems that might affect bridge safety.

- Per the AASHTO Manual for Bridge Evaluation (MBE) Section 2.2.1, the following photographs are to be included in the general file information for each bridge.
 - o Top view of the roadway across the bridge,
 - o a side elevation view of the bridge, and
 - o an under view of the main or typical span superstructure.
- Per IDOT Bridge Inspection Policy:

o For condition ratings ≤ "4" (Poor), all deficiencies <u>must</u> be documented with photographs. However, it is recommended photographs be taken during each inspection regardless of the condition of the bridge.

Summary

When performing Bridge Inspections, all notable deficiencies $\underline{\text{must}}$ be identified, and the narrative $\underline{\text{must}}$ appropriately justify and document the condition ratings. While it is good inspection practice to include comments for all condition ratings, Routine Inspection condition rating comments are $\underline{\text{required}}$ for condition ratings \leq "5" (Fair).

Condition ratings < "4" (Poor) must have photographs of all deficiencies to accompany

the condition rating comments. Routine Bridge Inspection Reports submitted without the correct documentation are considered "incomplete" and should be returned to appropriate party before entry into the BIS. It should be noted, Routine Inspections in

the BIS cannot be submitted or approved if condition rating comments are not provided for condition ratings of \leq "5".

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The Auditor's 1st Quarter Report was received and placed on file.

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The following (4) public comments were received and read aloud:

Dear Madison County Board Members,

I am writing because I am very concerned about comments by the president of our community recreational district board and the chairman of the Madison County Transit Board, Ron Jedda, towards a post by Collinsville High School students. It was apparent that the Black Student Union was fundraising by selling t-shirts and sweatshirts via the Collinsville Connections. Ron Jedda stated that "Black Lives Matter is a

divisive organization involved with rioting, destruction of property, and injury to innocent people. I don't condone those tactics and actions, and neither should other people."

As a high school parent, I am concerned that someone who represents Collinsville and Madison County has decided that the Black Student Union is a part of what he has decided is a divisive organization, and that BLM is being represented as a violent organization. The BLM protests have been studied extensively, and it is well known that 93% of demonstrations and marches were non-violent. One of these marches occurred in Collinsville in June of 2020, and there were no such concerns. I know that one of the other recreation board members, was also present at this march and can attest to the peaceful march.

It is time for such antiquated notions be put to rest. This board needs to consider the ramifications when a member sees fit to denigrate a community high school group on a public page. He also stated that "Identity politics is not a way to create good will." To be honest, I had no idea what this term meant. However, an adult in what seems to be a fairly important position (elected by the people?) in our community seems to be guilty of creating bad will, specifically against Black teens. I would love to see our boards truly serve the people it represents, including people of color.

I would like to suggest that this board member, possibly along with other board members, receive some training in diversity. There is the National Conference for Community and Justice of Metropolitan St. Louis (NCCJ St. Louis) that helps with organizational training. The local NAACP has been contacted and they have made a referral for training via SIUE.

I would hope that this individual who is supposed to be representing Collinsville and Madison County would apologize to the Black Student Union for his inappropriate remarks. It is disheartening to see an adult that is an elected official denigrate teenagers who are trying to fundraise, to support various community projects including the local blessing boxes. The board members may also want to look at the slide show/video the Black Student Union created and is posted on the Collinsville High School website, as an example of another project they have put together. I look forward to hearing about a possible solution to a problem that Ron Jedda created in our community, specifically with our high school students.

We again reached out to Breanna Buncher via email with more details in regards to the project and a narrative of who we are, which she again said we needed to work with the city of Collinsville and "From there, we can determine how the the County will be involved in this development." We closed on this property in good faith that we we're working again with local municipalities to add a viable and well received villa community as proven with our other 2 Madison

County communities; The Villas at Windsor Way in Troy off of HWY 162 and Gliddon Blvd. and The Villas of Remington in Maryville at Lakeview Acres Drive and Cider Crest Ct.

I feel we have taken the proper steps in requesting direction from the Zoning department and moving forward as requested. There were numerous reasons we chose this ground access to the bike trail, close proximity to other villa communities and residential developments, as well as shopping and restaurant locations within the Beltline and Keebler Rd. corridor. We researched the zoning map prior to purchase and accounted for the residential zoning directly surrounding our site.

The current zoning of R-1 allows for horses, chickens, goats as pets in a domesticated environment. However if the agricultural zoning is allowed the potential for livestock, Bovine and other animals that could create nuisance, could follow. This would dramatically detract from a well kept environment of a new subdivision. With the residential zoning and structures surrounding this location I felt this location of a quality option for development. With the passing of this zoning change it could greatly jeopardize the viability of this location as a desired location for new development.

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I Lloyd Mordis live at 5910 Galli Ln Collinsville IL 62234 am requesting 6 acres to be changed from R1 to Agricultural. I would like to be able to have livestock, such as goats or cows on the property to graze the pasture areas. The back of the property is roughly 1/2 of a mile from city limits and 1/4 mile off Keebler Road. I have obtained 9 of the 12 neighbors approval on a signed petition. 2 of those I am unable to obtain as one neighbor is hospitalized, the other is currently vacationing in Florida (snowbird) I have spoken with and he has given me his verbal approval. There is a vacant 10 acres that is in a trust that joins to a small portion of the back section of my property.

We have become entangled in the "safe and effective" propaganda campaign handed down from the WHO and the CDC to the public health departments in every state, and around the world.
